GUSTAVO DUDAMEL AND THE NEW YORK PHILHARMONIC

WORLD PREMIERE of Ravel's *Prélude et Danse de Sémiramis* Celebrating Ravels's 150th Birthday Artist-in-Residence Yuja Wang Performs Both Piano Concertos March 13–16, 2025

Two-Week Subscription Season Finale WORLD PREMIERE of Kate Soper's *Orpheus Orchestra Opus Onus* Works by Philip Glass, Stravinsky, and Mahler May 22–June 1, 2025

Concerts in the Parks Debut June 2025

The New York Philharmonic announces that **Gustavo Dudamel**, the Orchestra's future Oscar L. Tang and H.M. Agnes Hsu-Tang Music and Artistic Director, will reunite with the Orchestra in the spring of 2025, leading three weeks of subscription programs as well as, for the first time, the NY Phil Concerts in the Parks, Presented by Didi and Oscar Schafer.

Dudamel — who in 2025–26 will serve as Music and Artistic Director Designate — conducts a wide variety of repertoire, including the World Premiere of an NY Phil commission; collaborates with one of today's leading soloists; and leads the Philharmonic's celebration of the 150th anniversary of the birth of Ravel with the World Premiere of a recently discovered work by the seminal French composer.

Gustavo Dudamel leads the following subscription programs, all of which take place at the Wu Tsai Theater, David Geffen Hall:

 On March 13–16, 2025, Dudamel conducts concerts as the centerpiece of the Philharmonic's celebration of Ravel's 150th birthday. The program includes the World Premiere of Ravel's *Prélude et Danse de Sémiramis*, a recently discovered work composed by Ravel in 1900–02 (see page 2), as well as pianist Yuja Wang — the season's Mary and James G. Wallach Artist-in-Residence — as soloist in both of Ravel's piano concertos: the Piano Concerto for the Left Hand and the Piano Concerto in G major. The program also includes Varèse's *Amériques* (which the Orchestra has performed on only three occasions, all led by Music Directors — Pierre Boulez in 1975, Lorin Maazel in 2003, and Alan Gilbert in 2010) and Gershwin's *An American in Paris* (which the NY Phil first performed in its World Premiere in 1928).

- On May 22–24 and 27, 2025, Dudamel leads the World Premiere of Kate Soper's Orpheus Orchestra Opus Onus, an NY Phil commission (a result of her being named Kravis Emerging Composer as part of <u>The Marie-Josée Kravis Prize for New Music</u>); Soper herself, in her NY Phil debut, is the soprano soloist. The program for these concerts also includes Stravinsky's Symphony in Three Movements and Philip Glass's Symphony No. 11 (the NY Phil's first-ever performances of a Glass symphony).
- On May 29–June 1, 2025, the final concerts in the Philharmonic's subscription season, Dudamel leads Mahler's Symphony No. 7. The program marks a continuation of Dudamel's interpretations of Mahler — who served as NY Phil Music Director, 1909–11 — having previously led the Orchestra in Mahler's Symphony No. 5 (January 2009), *Das Lied von der Erde* (January 2020), and Symphony No. 9 (May 2023).

In addition to the three subscription programs, Dudamel, for the first time, will lead all four Concerts in the Parks, Presented by Didi and Oscar Schafer, <u>June 2025</u>. The program for these concerts will be announced at a later date.

About Ravel's Prélude et Danse de Sémiramis

Prélude et Danse de Sémiramis was written by Ravel sometime during the period of 1900–02, while he was studying composition at the Paris Conservatoire. Based on a Babylonian myth and heavily influenced by the Russian composers of the late Romantic period, particularly Rimsky-Korsakov, the piece is believed to have been composed in response to a prompt for the prestigious Prix de Rome — an honor Ravel tried for five times but famously never received. The manuscript of *Sémiramis* was eventually acquired in 2000 by the Bibliothèque nationale de France; its authenticity was later corroborated by a diary entry by Catalan pianist Ricardo Viñes, Ravel's childhood best friend, who attested to an early-morning play-through of the work at the Paris Conservatoire in 1902, attended by Ravel's family as well as his mentor, the composer Gabriel Fauré.

Viñes's diary and original Ravel manuscripts on loan from the Morgan Library & Museum will be on display at David Geffen Hall's Katherine and Gary W. Parr Archive Gallery, <u>March 3–May 20, 2025</u>, as part of *Ravel at 150*, a New York Philharmonic archival exhibition celebrating the legacy of the late French composer.
